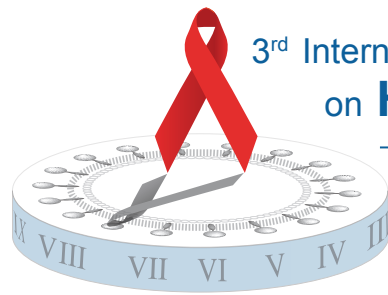


ANNOUNCEMENT AND CALL FOR ABSTRACTS
